



An Iliad of Albury and Other Poems



That someone should title a poem *Ephemera: An Iliad of Albury* is pretty much amazing. Yet in 1878, John Farrell sat at his apocryphal, or maybe even real, upturned beer barrel in Albury and wrote 58 stanzas in the first Canto of his *Iliad*.

Ephemera is one of the rarest volumes of Australian verse—a single copy is known to exist. *An Iliad of Albury and other Poems* compiles all poems John Farrell is known to have published while living and working in Albury. This is the first time Farrell's Albury work has been made available to readers since it first appeared in the late nineteenth century.


